



International Day of Plant Health 2024 Impact Report

Once again, the world witnessed an outstanding demonstration of the critical role of plant health in our lives, through the observance of the third International Day of Plant Health (IDPH) on 12 May 2024.

This year, IDPH highlighted the urgency of prioritizing plant health for sustainable economies and livelihoods. It reflected the importance of all stakeholders collaborating to protect plants and plant resources from pests and diseases, which impact global food security, international trade in crop commodities and economic growth.

Numerous diverse activities were held all over the world. From webinars, international conferences and tree planting to social media campaigns, exhibitions, and TV contests, IDPH 2024 was a unique unifying opportunity for the global community to raise awareness about plant health.

Governments, legislators, private sector players, farmers, students, donors, nonprofit organizations, researchers and even children used their most appropriate and available platforms to make the case for plant health action now and to observe IDPH.

From Malaysia and Vietnam to New Zealand and Tanzania, year's IDPH underscored a shared commitment to a message that resonates deeply: healthy plants are the foundation of a healthy planet and without plants, there is no life. This year's IDPH commemoration successfully galvanized a movement towards innovative solutions and leadership in plant health, reminding the world that indeed, plants are the cornerstone of life on Earth.
